Pursuant to West Virginia Code 18-2-26a, a special meeting of the Board of Education was held on November 9, 2017, at Tamarack, located at Beckley, West Virginia.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Danny G. Lively, President. Other members present were Candace Sabol, Barbara Fisher, and Andrew Evans. One member absent was Charles Sams. Superintendent Joetta Basile was present.

The Invocation was given by Mike Mitchem of McDowell County.

Christy Miller presented information related to the federal ESSA Plan and school accountability measures. Training information was presented to boards related to the West Virginia Department of Education Balanced Scorecard.


Jason Butcher offered information on the transition from RESA to ESC.

Dr. Vaughn Rudy shared information on statewide assessments. Grades three through eight will take the General Summative Assessment and grade eleven students will take the SAT School Day Test. The 95% testing requirement is a federal requirement. April 10, 2018, is Test Day with April 24, 2018, being a make-up day. Counties are required to administer benchmarks and show growth from the beginning of the school year through the end of the school year. Grade twelve SAT students in transition courses must take the SAT.
